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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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14	Section 1. Section 20-5-406, MCA, is amended to read:
15	"20-5-406. Immunization record. (1) The governing authority of each school shall require written
16	evidence of each pupil's student's immunization against the diseases listed in 20-5-403 and shall record the
17	immunization status, including any exemptions, of each pupil student as part of the pupil's student's permanent
18	school record.
19	(2) The governing authority shall conform with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and
20	Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. 1232g, as amended, and its implementing regulations at 34 CFR, part 99.
21	(3) A student's personally identifiable health records, including information related to
22	immunizations received and immunization exemptions, are considered part of the student's education record
23	and are protected from disclosure as provided in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.
24	(4) The governing authority of any school other than a postsecondary school shall file a written
25	report on immunizations and exemptions to immunizations under 20-5-405 for all students under its jurisdiction
26	with the department and the local health departmentat times and in the form prescribed by the department BY
27	DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR. The report may only include deidentified or aggregate information AND MUST
28	INCLUDE:



1	(A) HOW MANY STUDENTS ARE ENROLLED IN THE SCHOOL;
2	(B) THE NUMBER OF ENROLLED STUDENTS WITH VACCINE EXEMPTIONS;
3	(C) THE NUMBER OF FULLY VACCINATED STUDENTS; AND
4	(D) THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS WITH CONDITIONAL ENROLLMENT."
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6	Section 2. Section 20-5-408, MCA, is amended to read:
7	"20-5-408. Enforcement. (1) The governing authority of any school other than a postsecondary
8	school shall prohibit from further attendance any pupil-student allowed to attend conditionally who has failed to
9	obtain the immunizations required by 20-5-403(1) within time periods established by the department until that
10	pupil student has been immunized as required by the department or unless that pupil student has been
11	exempted under 20-5-405.
12	(2) The governing authority shall conform with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and
13	Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. 1232g, as amended, and its implementing regulations at 34 CFR, part 99.
14	(3) A student's health records, including information related to immunizations received and
15	immunization exemptions, are considered part of the student's education record and are protected from
16	disclosure as provided in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974."
