Description of fiscal impact

HB 194 revises laws related to requirements for notice and summons to jurors. This bill has no impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Judicial Branch

- Section 3 (6) requires the clerk of court to attempt to contact a nonresponding person summoned for a jury trial by telephone or other electronic communication. If the person fails to respond, the clerk of court will certify the failure to the sheriff who will make reasonable efforts to require the person to appear.
- The Judicial Branch reimburses counties for jury related costs including postage for jury summons. The Judicial Branch does not reimburse counties for the sheriff's costs related to making reasonable efforts to require the person to appear.
- There is no cost related to contacting nonresponding persons by telephone or other electronic communication, as such there is no fiscal impact to the Judicial Branch.
