Description of fiscal impact

HB 283 amends 87-2-722 (mountain sheep) and 87-2-724, MCA (Shiras moose) to expand the commission's discretionary from: Current law – authority to issue the license through a competitive auction to Proposed law – authority to issue the license through a competitive auction or lottery.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks

1. HB 283 changes the current sheep and moose-specific license auction statutes to align with the current mountain goat statute (87-2-725, MCA), which allows for competitive auction or lottery and would establish consistency across the board for all five licenses (mule deer, elk, mountain goat, mountain sheep, and moose) sold.
2. The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP) can not anticipate the chosen action of the commission, however it is likely to not increase/decrease revenue to these programs.
3. HB 283 allows for the organization to retain up to 10% to cover reasonable auction or lottery expenses. The other 90% of proceeds are returned to FWP and are used for substantial benefit of mountain sheep and Shiras moose.
