Description of fiscal impact

HB 33 will allow Fish Wildlife and Parks (FWP) to summarily dismiss any portion of a petition that raises an issue outside of FWP's regulatory jurisdiction or rulemaking authority, while maintaining the ability to move a portion of the petition forward. This will have no fiscal impact to FWP.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Fish Wildlife and Parks

1. The Fish Wildlife and Parks (FWP) already receives, processes, and manages citizen petitions asking for rulemaking, including areas that neither the department, the Fish and Wildlife Commission, nor the Parks and Outdoor Recreation Board have authority to regulate.
2. HB 33 will allow the FWP to dismiss any portion of a petition which raises an issue which falls outside of the department's regulatory jurisdiction or rulemaking authority. FWP must provide contact information for the appropriate agency or body with jurisdiction or authority over the issued raised in the petition.
3. Giving FWP the ability to dismiss any portion of a petition that does not fall under the purview of the FWP and allows FWP staff to respond more promptly and efficiently to citizen petitions.
