### Description of fiscal impact

HB 888 revises the powers of local boards of health related to isolation and quarantine orders. The bill prohibits a local board of health from requiring vaccination or medication as a condition of release from isolation or quarantine. There is a \$300 general fund appropriation to pay for the costs of implementation.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Assumptions

1. HB 888 revises the powers of local boards of health related to isolation and quarantine orders. The bill prohibits a local board of health from requiring vaccination or medication as a condition of release from isolation or quarantine. There is no fiscal impact to DPHHS in relation to this bill, as the costs associated in notifying all local boards of health of the statutory changes are de minimis, and the efforts needed to revise guidance documents, and hold training webinars can be absorbed with existing resources.
