Assumptions

Department of Public Health and Human Services (department)

- SB 191 creates a new Residential Treatment Center license type within the children's mental health system.
- The new license type is not amended into 53-6-101 (q), MCA, and will not be a Montana Medicaid service.
- New section 1 of SB 191 requires the department to adopt administrative rules and license Residential Treatment Centers. The department does not anticipate the number of new centers seeking to be licensed to be significant enough to have a fiscal impact.
