Description of fiscal impact

SB 506 allows a legislator to choose a preferred email address for electronic communications from the Legislative Branch or to be listed on the legislator's public profile as a point of contact for members of the public.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Legislative Branch

- 1. SB 506 allows a legislator to choose a preferred email address for electronic communications from the Legislative Branch or to be listed on the legislator's public profile as a point of contact for members of the public.
- 2. SB 506 requires legislators be responsible for managing emails related to legislative business in accordance with 2-6-10, MCA and 2-6-1012(1)(d), MCA.
- 3. The legislative office of information technology services (OLIS) uses only one domain for legislative information technology systems which include, but are not limited to, bill draft requests, collecting required legislator tax forms biennially, legislator direct deposit setup or modifications.
- 4. The 2027 biennium cost to redevelop the legislative IT systems to accommodate the use of external email addresses is estimated to be \$518,400 in development costs and \$60,000 for licensing. The total cost for the 2027 biennium is \$578,400. The total licensing cost for subsequent biennia is \$60,000 not including any inflationary factors.

Technical Concerns

Legislative Branch

- 1. SB 506 may conflict with HB 697 which requires "A public employee is expected to use the means for ecommunication provided by the public agency, including the public employee's public email account."
- 2. If SB 506 becomes law, and legislators use external emails, there is a security risk related to financial transactions.
- 3. If both SB 506 and HB 100 become law, a conflict will exist between legislators and the Legislative Branch regarding the responsibility to manage public information requests.
