Description of fiscal impact

SB 509 provides for the Agricultural Embedded Software Act to regulated digital electronics embedded in or attached to the mobile agricultural equipment and other similar equipment and accessories involved in agricultural processes that depend on such software for the equipment's functioning. The bill adds right to repair to the Department of Justice's Office of Consumer Protection (OCP) statutes. The private right of action in the statutes will take care of most of the violations. There will be no significant fiscal impact to the State.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

1. This bill adds right to repair to Department of Justice Office of Consumer Protection's (OCP) anti-trust statute. This is a private right of enforcement in that statute which will not affect OCP.
2. OCP can, but are not required to, enforce violations of this law. The private right of action will take care of most of the violations.
