Description of fiscal impact

Senate Bill 73 would establish statewide consistency for Emergency Protective Service notifications and necessitates the notification of prehearing conference facilitators within 24 hours of a child's removal from their home. Currently, the statute only requires notification to the Office of Public Defender. This bill adds an additional party to the notification process, but it does not create a fiscal impact.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Department of Public Health and Human Services

1. SB 73 necessitates the notification of prehearing conference facilitators within 24 hours of a child's removal from their home. Currently, the statute only requires notification to the Office of Public Defender. This bill adds an additional party to the notification process, but it does not create a fiscal impact.

Public Defender (OPD)

2. OPD assumes no fiscal impact with no substantive changes to defense provisions.

Judiciary

3. SB 73 would require the person placing a child in protective services to notify the prehearing conference facilitator, or another person who conducts prehearing conference in that district, within 24 hours.
4. Section 41-3-307, MCA, would be amended to require a prehearing conference be held within 5 days of a child's removal and before an emergency protective services hearing held.
5. The proposed amendments do not have a fiscal impact on the Judicial Branch.

Department of Justice

6. SB 73 will not cause any additional cases therefore no fiscal impact is expected.
